## STATE INITIATIVES

### ELDERLY OR INFIRMED INMATES

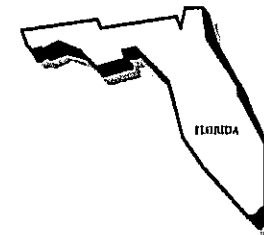
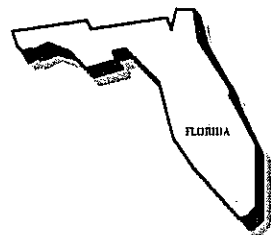
THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS DEFINES ELDERLY INMATES AS ALL THOSE AGED 50 YEARS AND OLDER. AS OF JULY 2005, ELDERLY INMATES WHO DO NOT HAVE SPECIAL NEEDS CAN BE ASSIGNED TO ANY ADULT INSTITUTION; HOWEVER, THOSE WITH SPECIAL NEEDS ARE ASSIGNED TO FOUR CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES - RIVER JUNCTION WORK CAMP (353 INMATES), UNION CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTION (2,050 INMATES), ZEPHYRHILLS CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTION (691 INMATES), AND SOUTH FLORIDA RECEPTION CENTER SOUTH UNIT (564 INMATES). THERE ARE TWO CATEGORIES OF ELDERLY FACILITIES: ELDERLY INMATES (50+) AND ELDERLY OFFENDERS (59+).

AS OF JUNE 30, 2005, 11.6% (9,883) OF THE 84,901 INMATES IN THE STATUS POPULATION WAS AGE 50 OR OLDER.

### PRISON BASED SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT PROGRAMS

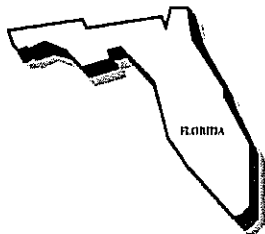
ON JULY 1, 2000, THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS IMPLEMENTED MANDATORY SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROGRAM PARTICIPATION FOR INMATES MEETING SELECT CRITERIA. AN AUTOMATED SCREENING AND PRIORITY PLACEMENT SYSTEM WAS IMPLEMENTED TO IDENTIFY INMATES MEETING THE CRITERIA FOR THE PROGRAM AND TO PRIORITIZE THEM BASED ON RISK TO PUBLIC SAFETY AND SEVERITY OF ADDICTION. \$7.8 MILLION OF STATE FUNDS WERE SPENT FOR CONTRACTED SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROGRAM SERVICES AT PUBLIC FACILITIES.

### PRISON BASED SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT PROGRAMS

FLORIDA'S SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROGRAMS OFFERED:

- PREVENTION PROGRAMMING (TIER 1 - 1 LOCATION): VOLUNTARY SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROGRAM FOR ADULT AND YOUTHFUL OFFENDER FEMALE INMATES.
- INTENSIVE OUTPATIENT PROGRAMMING (MODALITY 1 - 20 LOCATIONS): 4-6 MONTH OUTPATIENT (W/IN PRISON SETTING) PROGRAM AT DESIGNED INSTITUTIONS FOR 1/2 DAY AT LEAST 4 DAYS A WEEK WITH A MINIMUM OF 12 HOURS OF COUNSELOR-SUPERVISED ACTIVITIES.
- RESIDENTIAL THERAPEUTIC COMMUNITY (MODALITY 2 - 6 LOCATIONS): 9-12 MONTH PROGRAM HOUSED WITHIN INSTITUTION OR A DESIGNATED COMMUNITY-BASED FACILITY.
- PROGRAM CENTER (CONTINUUM OF SERVICES - 3 LOCATIONS): MODIFIED THERAPEUTIC COMMUNITY TO PROVIDE PREVENTION, OUTPATIENT, AND AFTERCARE SERVICES, AS WELL AS EDUCATION/VOCATIONAL SERVICES.

### PRE-RELEASE/POST-RELEASE ("REENTRY") PROGRAMS

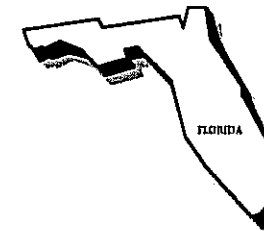
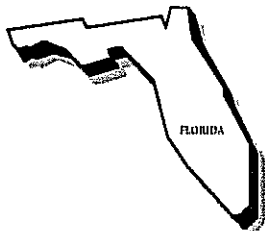
IN FY 2004-05, 31,537 OFFENDERS WERE RELEASED FROM FLORIDA'S PRISONS. THE DEPARTMENT DOES HAVE PRE-RELEASE PROGRAMS AND PROVIDES POST-RELEASE ASSISTANCE FOR INMATES TO FACILITATE A SMOOTH TRANSITION FROM PRISON TO THE COMMUNITY. THESE PROGRAMS PROVIDE INMATES WITH EDUCATIONAL, VOCATIONAL, AND LIFE SKILLS TRAINING. THESE PROGRAMS ARE FUNDED THROUGH A COMBINATION OF GENERAL REVENUE AND GRANT FUNDING SOURCES.

1. 100-HOUR TRANSITION PROGRAM IS A STATUTORILY MANDATED COMPREHENSIVE TRANSITION PROGRAM THAT COVERS JOB READINESS AND LIFE MANAGEMENT SKILLS. THIS TRAINING IS PROVIDED TO ALL INMATES WITHIN 12 MONTHS OF THEIR RELEASE FROM A FLORIDA PRISON.
2. FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS OFFERS 31 DIFFERENT VOCATIONAL TRADES TO INMATES ENROLLED IN VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AT 28 CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES.
3. A FEDERAL GRANT (SPECTER GRANTS FOR YOUTHFUL OFFENDERS PROGRAM) THAT PROVIDES POST-SECONDARY VOCATIONAL TRAINING FOR YOUTHFUL OFFENDERS 25 YEARS OF AGE AND UNDER THROUGH PRIVATE CONTRACTORS AND ACCREDITED POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS.
4. IN FY 04-05, THERE WERE 2,286 COMPLETIONS IN MANDATORY LITERACY, ADULT BASIC EDUCATION, AND GED COURSES.
5. PROJECT RECONNECT SELECTS INMATES TO RECEIVE ASSISTANCE UPON RELEASE WITH EMPLOYMENT AND LINKAGES TO COMMUNITY RESOURCES TO HELP THEM EASE THE TRANSITION FROM PRISON TO THE COMMUNITY. PROJECT RECONNECT CONDUCTS JOB FAIRS AND CAREER EXPLORATION SEMINARS AROUND THE STATE.

6. WORKFORCE FLORIDA ESTABLISHES COOPERATIVE RELATIONSHIPS WITH WORKFORCE BOARDS AND ONE-STOP CENTERS TO FACILITATE STATEWIDE JOB PLACEMENTS AND COMMUNITY RESOURCE REFERRALS FOR EX-INMATES.
7. THE FLORIDA SAFETY COUNCIL MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT PROVIDES ADVANCED DRIVER INSTRUCTION FOR INMATES WITH A SUSPENDED, REVOKED, OR EXPIRED DRIVER'S LICENSE.
8. THE FAITH BASED SUBSTANCE ABUSE POST-RELEASE TRANSITIONAL HOUSING PROGRAM PROVIDES UP TO 400 BEDS FOR INMATES BEING RELEASED FROM THE DEPARTMENT.
9. THE FAITH BASED DORMITORY PROGRAM IS A 12-MONTH VOLUNTARY PROGRAM THAT SEEKS TO UNITE CORRECTIONS AND THE FAITH COMMUNITY TO EFFECT AN INNER TRANSFORMATION OF INMATES.
10. THE SERIOUS AND VIOLENT OFFENDER REENTRY PROGRAM IS A GRANT AWARDED BY THE US DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE TO REDUCE RECIDIVISM, INCREASE PUBLIC SAFETY, AND SUCCESSFULLY REINTEGRATE OFFENDERS BACK INTO THE COMMUNITY.
11. LIFERS PROGRAM (MEN GOING HOME) PROVIDES BETTERMENT SERVICES TO MALE INMATES SENTENCED TO LIFE IN PRISON PRIOR TO 1983. THE PROGRAM ASSISTS THE INMATES TO UNDERSTAND THE CAUSES OF DRUG ADDICTION. INMATES ARE ASSISTED WITH BEHAVIOR, ATTITUDES, VALUES, PERSONAL EFFECTIVENESS AND RESPONSIBLE DECISION-MAKING. THE FOCUS IS TO ASSIST INMATES WHO HAVE BEEN INCARCERATED 25 YEARS OR LONGER PREPARE FOR COMMUNITY REENTRY.
12. OPERATION NEW HOPE PROVIDES RE-ENTRY SERVICES TO ELIGIBLE INMATES AGES 18-34, WHO HAVE BEEN SENTENCED AND SERVED TIME FOR NON-VIOLENT AND NON-SEXUAL FELONY OFFENSES.
13. M.A.D. DADS OF GREATER OCALA (MEN AGAINST DESTRUCTION - DEFENDING AGAINST DRUGS AND SOCIAL DISORDERS) ENABLES INMATES AND EX-INMATES TO PARTICIPATE IN TRANSITION AND RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS INTENDED TO FACILITATE REENTRY INTO THE COMMUNITY.

### CONCERNS WITH AGING ADULT CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES

FLORIDA HAS OVER 70 CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS WITH THEM RANGING IN AGE FROM 90 YEARS OLD TO ONLY 1 YEAR OLD. THE GOVERNOR'S BUDGET RECOMMENDATIONS FOR SPECIFIC MAINTENANCE FUNDING OVER THE LAST FEW YEARS HAVE LARGELY BEEN IGNORED BY THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE. CRITICAL MAINTENANCE ISSUES CONTINUE TO BE ADDRESSED BY EXPENDING OPERATING FUNDS.
