COURT ORDER REQUIREMENTS

AS OF JUNE 30, 2005, THE KENTUCKY DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS IS NOT UNDER A FEDERAL OR STATE COURT ORDER.

STATE INITIATIVES

ELDERLY OR INFIRMED INMATES

THE KENTUCKY DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS HAS BEEN PREPARED FOR SEVERAL YEARS TO HANDLE AN INCREASINGLY AGING POPULATION OF OFFENDERS. CURRENTLY, THERE IS A SKILLED NURSING CARE FACILITY THAT HOUSES UP TO 55 INMATES WITH CONDITIONS REQUIRING NURSING HOME ENVIRONMENTS. MANY OF THESE INMATES ARE GERIATRIC IN CLASSIFICATION. THE FACILITY IS CONTAINED WITHIN THE PRIMARY MEDICAL PRISON. FUNDING IS DIRECTLY FROM THE DOC MEDICAL DIVISION BUDGET FOR OVERALL INMATE MEDICAL CARE. THE DEPARTMENT IS ALSO EXPLORING COMMUNITY PLACEMENT OPTIONS, NURSING HOME CONTRACTS, PURCHASING A NURSING HOME THROUGH A COLLABORATIVE AGREEMENT WITH A STATE UNIVERSITY AND THE POTENTIAL FOR MEDICAID REIMBURSEMENT OF NON-PRISON HOUSED NURSING CARE INMATES. THESE OPTIONS ARE BEING EXPLORED TO ADDRESS THE EXPECTED CONTINUED INCREASE IN GERIATRIC POPULATIONS.

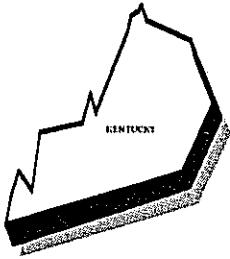
PRISON BASED SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT PROGRAMS

THE STATE OF KENTUCKY, DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS CURRENTLY OPERATES SIX PRISON BASED PROGRAMS AND THREE JAIL PROGRAMS FOR THOSE STATE INMATES CLASSIFIED AS JAIL STATUS. PRISON AND JAIL PROGRAMS ARE THERAPEUTIC COMMUNITIES (TC). BY YEAR END, THERE WILL BE 8 PRISON PROGRAMS AND 8 JAIL PROGRAMS. PRISON FUNDING IS THROUGH THE DEPARTMENT BUDGET AND JAIL PROGRAMS ARE THROUGH GRANTS. THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE PROGRAMS ARE DETERMINED BY REGULAR AUDITS THROUGH THE DEPARTMENT'S DIVISION OF MENTAL HEALTH. RECIDIVISM RATES ARE BEING TRACKED WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF THE UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY, DIVISION OF MENTAL HEALTH. DATA FROM ALL INMATES ENTERING SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROGRAMS IS ENTERED INTO A DATA BASE TO BE COMPARED TO GENERAL POPULATION INMATES.

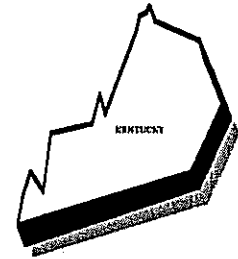

PRE-RELEASE/POST-RELEASE ("REENTRY") PROGRAMS

THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS OPERATES A PROGRAM CALLED THE PRISON TO STREET PROGRAM. IT PROVIDES EDUCATIONAL, VOCATIONAL, SUBSTANCE ABUSE, PARENTING CLASSES, AND WORK PROGRAMS. THE DEPARTMENT ALSO USES AN OBJECTIVE CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM IN ORDER TO HOUSE INMATES IN THE LOWEST CUSTODY SETTING. THERE ARE SOME INSTITUTIONS THAT HAVE MENTORING PROGRAMS, VOLUNTEER PROGRAMS. THE PRE-RELEASE COORDINATOR DOES ASSIST THE INMATE WITH SENDING OUT HOME AND JOB PLACEMENT PLANS. IF THE INMATE DOES NOT HAVE HOME PLACEMENT, THE STAFF ASSIST IN GETTING INMATES PLACED IN COMMUNITY CENTERS. IN THE EVENT PAROLE INMATES HAVE NO HOME PLACEMENT AND ARE SUBMITTED FOR ACCEPTANCE IN COMMUNITY CENTERS, IT IS FUNDED BY THE DEPARTMENT. THERE ARE FAITH BASED RESOURCES AND COMMUNITY RESOURCES THAT ARE IDENTIFIED IN THE PRISON TO STREET PROGRAM.



CONCERNS WITH AGING ADULT CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES

KENTUCKY HAS 13 CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES WITH AN AVERAGE AGE OF 44 YEARS OLD. KENTUCKY STATE PENITENTIARY IS THE OLDEST FACILITY (121 YEARS OLD), WHILE THE NEWEST FACILITY IS LITTLE SANDY CORRECTIONAL COMPLEX AT 6 MONTHS. KENTUCKY'S FACILITIES ARE WELL MAINTAINED BY IN-HOUSE STAFF. ALL PASS ACI INSPECTIONS. THE ONLY PROBLEMS ARE PREVENTIVE AND PREDICTIVE MAINTENANCE, WHICH REQUIRES SPECIAL EQUIPMENT, TOOLS, AND TRAINING.
